Cllr Jenkins raised the issue of new homes being built in a sustainable way. He requested if the Parish Council could lobby SGC to encourage them to make it planning policy that all new homes are built to ensure they are as energy efficient as possible. This could be put to SGC to include in the new Local Plan that is currently being consulted on. It was agreed that several councillors will work together to draft correspondence to go to SGC, to be referred back to Full Council for approval. Cllr Kembery advised there is an area on Frenchay Common where the bunding does not look too secure. This may need reinforcing. He encouraged councillors to let the Clerk know if there were any other areas which are potentially vulnerable. Cllr Whatley confirmed the planning application for Frenchay Museum has now been recommended for approval. The Parish Council would like to thank Cllr Ben Burton for his help with this. Cllr Kembery also thanked Cllr Whatley for all his hard work on this application.

It was confirmed that thanks to Cllr Serjent pursuing the issue, the trees overhanging Damson's bridge have now been cut back.

The objective of this is to work collectively with other organisations for the good of nature in the community and it will enable the Parish Council to be proactive. This Local Nature Action Plan is a declaration of what the Parish Council will do to help nature's recovery in the Parish.

Resolved that Winterbourne Parish Council will produce a LNAP. Cllrs Dyer and Labuschagne agreed to join the working group.
